District Meeting Voting Eligibility

You are a member and eligible to Vote at your District Meeting if your membership account for services is located in the landline telephone exchange boundaries of the District holding the election of a Trustee; and,

You subscribe to a retail landline dial tone service with Pioneer Telephone Cooperative, Inc.

OF

You subscribe to a retail landline stand-alone Digital Subscriber Line Service (DSL), provided by and using Pioneer Telephone Cooperative, Inc.'s landline copper or fiber facilities, with or without a corresponding analog voice (dial tone) service.

At its regular Board Meeting on July 8, 2005, the Pioneer Board of Trustees adopted the following policy with regard to voting in district elections.

Only those properly identified will be able to cast a vote for specific business entities; they will be required to sign documentation to verify their position with the respective member.

The following individuals will be able to vote for the various business entities identified.

- 1. Individual either husband or wife can vote.
- Joint Tenancy limited to husband and wife, grandfathered only. We no longer permit people to sign up in joint tenancy status; however, this could be voted by either joint tenant.
- **3. Sole Proprietorship** these memberships can only be voted by the owner or co-owner.
- **4. General Partnership** any general partner can cast a vote for the partnership.
- **5. Limited Partnership** only a general partner can vote.
- **6. Corporation** these memberships can only be voted by the general manager, or the president, or the vice-president.
- Limited Liability Company (LLC) can be voted only by a member.
- Limited Liability Partnership can be voted only by a member.
- **9. Trust** can be voted only by a trustee.
- **10. Hospitals** can be voted only by the administrator, or president, or vice-president of the board.
- **11. Volunteer Fire Departments** in unincorporated areas can be voted only by the fire chief or assistant fire chief.
- **12. Churches,** including **Parsonages** if set out as a separate membership and held in the name of the Church can only be voted by the minister, or chairman, or vice-chairman of the governing body.
- **13. Club/Lodge/Miscellaneous Associations** can only be voted by the chairman or the vice-chairman of the governing board.

- **14. Senior Citizen Center** can only be voted by the chairman or vice-chairman of the governing board.
- **15. Schools** can only be voted by the superintendent, or president, or vice-president of the school board.
- **16. Tribal Government** can only be voted by the chief, or assistant chief, or chairman, or vice-chairman.
- **17. Municipalities** all city offices of any type can only be voted by the city manager, or mayor, or any elected member of the governing board of the city or town.
- **18. County Government** if all county offices are covered by one membership, the county can only be voted by one of the county commissioners or the county clerk. Those county offices that have individual memberships can be voted only by the elected official.
- **19. State Government Offices** can only be voted by the individual in charge of the local office of the State agency involved, if it possesses a separate membership.
- **20. Federal Government Offices** can only be voted by the individual in charge of the local office of the Federal agency involved, if it possesses a separate membership.
- **21. Conservatorship/Guardianship** these memberships can only be voted by the court appointed conservator or guardian.
- **22. Powers of Attorney** no Powers of Attorney, including Durable Powers of Attorney, are authorized to vote.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) Nears Its End: What You Need to Know

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) has proven beneficial for millions of low-income households in the United States, providing them with affordable access to the internet for work, education, healthcare, and more. However, as of February 7, 2024, the ACP is no longer accepting new applications or enrollments. This marked the beginning of its wind-down phase.

What is the Affordable Connectivity Program?

The ACP was established in 2021 under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, with an appropriation of \$14.2 billion. It aimed to bridge the digital divide by providing financial assistance to eligible households, ensuring they could afford broadband internet services. The program offered a discount of up to \$30 per month for internet service and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

Eligibility Criteria:

To qualify for the ACP, households needed to meet one of the following criteria:

- Have a household income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Receive a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year.
- Meet the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program.
- Participate in specific government assistance programs, including SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Housing Assistance, WIC, and more.
- Live on qualifying Tribal lands and participate in designated assistance programs.

The ACP's Impact:

Since its inception, the ACP has made a significant impact, with over 22 million households enrolled and benefiting from the program as of January 2024. It has helped bridge the digital divide by providing affordable internet access to underserved communities.

Why is it ending?

The primary reason for the ACP's wind-down is the projected depletion of its \$14.2 billion funding, estimated to occur in April 2024 (though this date is subject to change). Here's what you need to know about the ACP wind-down:

- 1. **Deadline for New Enrollments:** The ACP has stopped processing new applications and enrollments. The deadline was February 7, 2024, at 11:59 PM ET.
- 2. Continuation for Existing Enrollees: Households that have been approved and are already receiving the monthly internet discount before February 8, 2024, will continue to receive their ACP benefit until the program's funds run out, which is expected in April 2024.
- **3. Communication with Enrolled Households:** Enrolled ACP households will receive notices from Pioneer about the end of the benefit, its impact on their bills, the date of the last bill including the ACP benefit, and options to change or opt-out of service.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION NATIONAL AND PIONEER DO-NOT-CALL LISTS

NATIONAL Do-Not-Call Registration

The Federal Trade Commission has established a National Do-Not-Call Registry for residential consumers and cell phone users that do not wish to receive commercial solicitation over their telephone. Pioneer honors Do Not Call requests on this national list, as well as state lists and Pioneer's internal Do Not Call List.

The National Registry is nationwide and will preclude telephone solicitations made for commercial purposes only; but will not prevent all unwanted calls. It does not cover the following:

- calls from organizations with which you have recently done business with or calls for which you have given prior written permission; but if you ask them not to call you, they must stop. Be sure to write down the date you asked them to stop;
- political calls (call cannot include a sales pitch);
- charitable calls (call cannot include a sales pitch);
- debt collection calls (call cannot include a sales pitch);
- purely informational calls (call cannot include a sales pitch);
- surveys (call cannot include a sales pitch); and
- · scam calls.

Robocalls – a call that plays a recorded message – is selling something, it is illegal unless the company trying to sell you something got written permission, directly from you, to call you that way.

So if you haven't given the company permission, and the

robocall isn't purely informational — like your cable company confirming a service appointment — there's a good chance it's a scam. At the very least, it's from a company you don't want to do business with.

If you get an illegal robocall, hang up. Don't press buttons to be taken off a call list or to talk to a live person. It might lead to more unwanted calls. Instead, report it to the Federal Trade Commission at www.donotcall.gov.

Once you register your phone number(s), telemarketers covered by the National Do-Not-Call Registry have up to 31 days from the date you register to stop calling you.

You may register your residential telephone number(s) and your personal cell phone number(s) by calling the toll-free number, 1-888-382-1222 and for TTY access, 1-866-290-4236 (call from phone you want to register). You will need to call from each phone number you want to register. Business phone numbers and fax lines are not covered by Do Not Call.

The Internet web address for registrations is donotcall.gov. Registration is permanent, unless you revoke such objection by calling the toll-free number, or by using the Internet access listed above. You will need to call from each phone number you want to register.

PIONEER Do-Not-Call Registration

Pioneer maintains a do-not-call list that you may register with if you do not wish to receive telemarketing calls from us at a specific telephone number. If you would like to register, please dial 611 from your landline or cellular phone, or call 1-888-PTC-COOP (1-888-782-2667) to ask that your number be listed on Pioneer's do-not-call list.

In response to your request, Pioneer will update its list within 30 days of your request. Your number will remain on the list for five years unless you ask us to remove it sooner.

If your number is on Pioneer's do-not-call list, Pioneer and its representatives will not contact the listed number for sales promotions or other marketing campaigns. Pioneer may still contact that number for non-telemarketing purposes such as customer service surveys, public interest notices, or other service-related matters.
